Your employer is there to HELP

You know how <u>YOU</u> can protect your health and safety at work:

- Learn about hazards and watch for them
- Follow your training when completing your tasks
- Use your voice to say what you need

But do you know what role your <u>EMPLOYER</u> plays in your health and safety?

The more **YOU** know about that, the easier it is to ask for help when you need it.



Do you know we have a workplace health and safety law on PEI?

The **Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) Act** protects the health and safety of all of us at work, whether that is an office, a grocery store, a fishing boat, a hospital wherever we work! Check out the OHS Act yourself, or read below for an outline of employer duties.



Do you know what the OHS Act says about employer duties?

- "Employers must take all reasonable precautions to protect the health and safety of all in the workplace."
- Employers don't have to do it all themselves, but they **DO** need to ensure it gets done.

Employer Duties



Maintain machinery and equipment to ensure it is safe for worker use

- Inspect equipment regularly
- Keep equipment clean and dry
- Replace worn parts and complete repairs as necessary

Make workers and supervisors familiar with all workplace hazards

- Point out hazards during job-specific training
- Establish and provide training on hazard control methods
- Use barricades, railings and lock-out to prevent injury caused by hazards

Provide training for all tasks assigned and supervise workers

- Training should be provided by someone experienced and competent
- New and young workers, in particular, should be closely supervised

Ensure workers wear and use personal protective equipment (PPE) that is required for a task

• If a particular kind of PPE is unsuitable for a worker to wear and use, the employer should work with them to find a suitable alternative

Cooperate with their Safety Committee or Safety Representative

Report any serious workplace injuries to the WCB's Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) Division

• Serious workplace injuries can be reported 24 hours a day, 365 days a year by calling the OHS Emergency Line at 902-628-7513
